
## Kenneth Goings - Paulding High School Class of 1969

Ken received his B.S. in Education from Kent State University, M.A. and Ph.D. in History from Princeton University. Ken began his teaching career at the College of Wooster and has taught at Rhodes College, Memphis Tennessee; Florida Atlantic University, Boca Raton, Florida; The University of Memphis, Memphis Tennessee; and is currently a Professor at Ohio State University where he has also served as Chair in the Department of African American and African Studies. Ken has received numerous awards for his publications, including the Outstanding Book Award on the Subject of Human Rights from the Gustavus Myers Center in 1990 for his work titled The N.A.A.C.P. Comes of Age: The Defeat of Judge John J. Parker and in 1994 for his book Mammy and Uncle Mose: Black Collectibles and American Stereotyping. He was also featured on the CBS News' Sunday Morning, discussing the history of black memorabilia.
