What is Title 1?

Title 1 is a federal assistance program for schools that provides additional academic support for students. The goal of Title 1 is to help every child meet the academic standards and get a high quality education. Title 1 provides millions of children with the help they need to be successful in school.

What Title 1 Offers

- Classroom support
- Individualized and small group instruction designed to meet the unique needs of each child
- Extra learning experiences created to reinforce and enrich regular classroom activities
- A variety of teaching methods and materials
- Title 1 teachers and homeroom teachers working together to support your child

Qualifying for Title 1

Students qualify for Title 1 services based on academic need. A variety of assessment data is used to target those students who are struggling to meet Ohio's academic standards in language arts. Once students are identified, Title 1 teachers work together with the classroom teachers to provide individualized and small group instruction to improve these skills.

What a Day in Title 1 Looks like

- A class is for 30 minutes 5 days a week
- Start off with the Hunks and Chunks Chant
- Introduce the topic of the day
 - New hunk and chunk
 - Phonics 1st lesson
 - Review previous sounds
 - Introduce new letter/sound
 - Blending drill
- Activity involving the skill of the day
- Clean up
- Exit ticket
 - Question over skill/lesson of the day

Measuring Progress

- Student progress is measured by several assessment methods
 - Star Reading
 - Vendor assessment for the district
 - Fast Foreword & Reading assistant
 - Program purchased from Title 1 funds to help improve reading skills
 - Individualized to each student
 - Classroom assessments and student's work
- Progress reports are sent home in the middle of the marking period
- Report cards are sent home quarterly
 - Can always check grades online using Progress Book
